REYKJANES GEOPARK

Reykjanes Geopark lies on major plate boundaries along the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, part of the 65,000km mid-ocean ridge that encircles the earth like a seam of a baseball. Although 90% of this mountain range lies deep below the surface of the ocean, it rises above sea-level right here on the Reykjanes Peninsula, making it the optimal location to witness the undying forces of these plate boundaries.

It is home to many important geological formations, some of which are utterly unique, including numerous types of volcanoes in at least four separate volcanic zones, with hundreds of open fissures and faults.

The Reykjanes Peninsula is a continuation of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, which rises from the sea at the very tip of the peninsula and diagonally crosses Iceland from the south-west to the north-east. You can read the area's geological history several hundred thousand years back in time, although most of the strata are less than 100-200 thousand years old. The last series of eruptions on the Reykjanes Peninsula began around AD 1000 and ended 250 years later. A new volcanic era began in 2021 with a great spectacle in the Fagradalsfjall volcanic eruptions that captured the world's attention.

Reykjanes peninsula is a UNESCO Global Geopark, with its unique geological features and rich history that is intertwined with the Icelandic history and culture. It is the second geopark in Iceland and the 66th member accepted into the European Geoparks Network in September 2015.

Reykjanes Geoparks mission, along with its partners, is to develop a sustainable region for businesses and municipalities, an interesting place to live in and opportunities for growth and product development and added value, together with the preservation of natural and cultural values.



Reykjanesbær

Reykjanes really does live up to its name - it literally means "the Smoking Peninsula." The word "bær" simply means town.





Reykjanesbær is a young and dynamic community with a diverse and rapidly expanding population. The district spreads over the Reykjanes Peninsula and it includes the UNESCO Global Geopark, which was recognised because of its geological heritage of outstanding universal value.

For centuries the sea and its rich fishing grounds have shaped a thriving community in Reykjanesbær. The district's significance increased with the arrival of the NATO Defence Forces at Keflavík International Airport. Today the airport is one of the largest workplaces in Iceland, and which caters for considerable numbers of tourists every year. It is safe to say that Reykjanes or Suðurnes is often the first and last destination for those who come to Iceland from around the world.

Here, nature is breathtaking and the energy from deep underground has shaped the landscape, where you can find rows of craters, moss-grown lava, spitting hot springs, and the Blue Lagoon, which has been called one of the Modern Wonders of the World. Reykjanes has one of the largest bird colonies in Europe and is popular for bird watching, whether viewing in the rocks or beaches. The possibilities for outdoor activities are almost endless. The coastal route of Reykjanesbær is a 10 km hiking trail that runs from Helguvík to Stapi and is popular with locals and visitors as it is offers a unique view of the sea and, if you are lucky, you could catch a glimpse of the occasional whale. The birdlife by the beach is usually quite varied.

Museums and Culture

Reykjanesbær has a rich musical culture and has been known to be referred to as the home of pop music in Iceland. You can experience this unique story in the Rock Museum of Iceland in Hljómahöll.

Duus Museum, which previously housed Danish merchants selling fish, is now the town's cultural center, where there are interesting galleries at the Art Museum and the Regional Museum.

Viking World is a magnificent exhibition hall that houses a reconstruction of the Viking ship, Íslendingur, that sailed to America in 2000 to commemorate Leif Eiríksson's voyage to the New World.

Downtown - Hafnargata

The historic downtown lies along the coastline above the historic shopping stalls of the Duus merchants, where shops date back to the 19th century. You can find a number of shops with a diverse product range. After shopping, it is easy to find places to eat as Hafnargata has a rich food culture.











Guidelines

- The port is near the center of town and the townspeople can hear sounds from ships very clearly. Please avoid using the outer deck loud speaker system, especially in the morning or late at night.
- All the hot water in Reykjanes is geothermally heated. Be sure to visit the local swimming pool.
- Take a stroll through Reykjanesbær, which is an old fishing village maturing into a vibrant town with old historic houses surrounded by nature. A 10 km hiking path by the coast, from the old marina to Viking World, gives an opportunity to see vibrant birdlife, active harbours, and outdoor artwork. Along the main shopping street, Hafnargata, you will find interesting shops, boutiques, art galleries, restaurants, and the Duus Culture House.
- There are many hiking trails in Reykjanes that are fun to explore, but be aware of the delicate nature (lava fields and moss) and do not hike outside marked trails.

- The northern lights season is from late August until late April. The darker and brighter the skies, the better for seeing the Aurora Borealis, though we cannot guarantee sightings! Wear something bright as we cannot see you in the dark.
- Summers are fresh and winters fairly mild. July is the warmest month and January the coolest. Dress accordingly and dress in layers.
- Icelandic cuisine is an offshoot of Nordic cuisine, known worldwide for the freshness of the food and inspired fusion of cooking styles. There are a great variety of options to tickle your palate.
- Meet the locals. Our community is very visitor friendly.
 Be sure to stop for a chat, but respect the boundaries of our homes.
- Put your trash in the trash bins this way, you help us to keep our town clean and neat.

STROLL THROUGH THE TOWN

GUNNUHVER AND OTHER GEOTHERMAL AREAS

The bubbling mud pots and hot springs tint Reykjanes in a range of colours and shapes that catch the eye. The rising plumes of steam frame the lively mud pots, reminding us of the power below. The hot springs and pools are constantly changing.

Gunnuhver is Iceland's largest mud pot – the crater is 20 metres in diameter. Its name refers to a ghostly woman, Guðrún, who haunted the area until pastor Eiríkur Magnússon of Vogsósar managed to banish her to her muddy resting place, the Gunnuhver mud pot.



THE VOLCANIC EXPERIENCE

Since August 21st, 2022 there has been no visible activity in Meradalir Volcano. No flowing lava can be seen at the moment, but the hiking path remains open. MORE INFORMATION

GEOTHERMAL ENERGY

Geothermal areas are tied to the volcanic area that traverses the peninsula. There are two geothermal powerplants in Svartsengi and Reykjanes tip with combined power of 175 MW. Within Reykjanes Geopark is the Resource Park, a cluster of innovative and green companies sustainably utilizing waste streams and excess heat from the powerplants.

KLEIFARVATN AND SELTÚN

Kleifarvatn is a unique still lake only a short distance from Reykjavik. The water is extremely deep and therefore likely that a monster lurks under the still surface. Nearby is the wonderful geothermal area Seltún with bubbling hot pools and smelly sulphate and Grænavatn a crater filled with water of the most amazing green hue.

STRÆTO - PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN REYKJANESBAER



The public transport bus network in Reykjanesbaer consists of 3 routes (R1, R3 and R4), connecting the neighbourhoods of the town in addition to a direct route to the capital of Iceland (55) and other towns in Reykjanes region (88, 89).

The busses operate every weekday from 7am to 10 pm and 10am to 6 pm on Saturdays.

The local network is connected to the Stræto's bus network of the capital area that consists of 27 routes.





ACCOMMODATION IN REYKJANES




